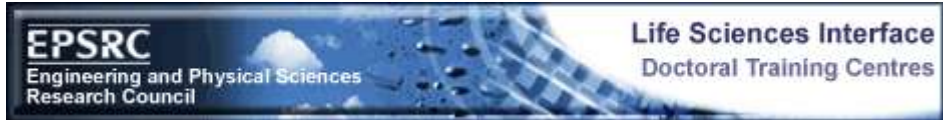

SURE CARE project: investigating service user perceptions of patient safety and facilitated reporting of adverse incidents in clinical care

The successful applicant will work on the SURE CARE patient safety project, linking in with the North East SHA Patient Safety Action Team and CETL4Health NE. The project will investigate service user perceptions of patient safety and develop a method of facilitating service users to identify and report self-defined adverse incidents in clinical care. The study will be mainly qualitative in nature. In Phase 1, data will be collected from service users about what 'safe' care looks and feels like for them. In Phase 2, a system of identifying and reporting adverse events will be devised. The final output of the PhD studentship will be a reporting system that could be trialled in a clinical care setting.

Applications are invited from candidates holding or expecting to have a first class or upper second class degree (or equivalent).

It is anticipated that the studentship will commence in late Sept/early October 2008. The studentship funding pays tuition fees at the UK/EU rate (£3,332 p.a. from September 2008) and a stipend of £12,940 p.a.
